

Many Westdale residents are not familiar with Call "211". It's a great year round resource to add to your list of critical phone numbers. Information is provided about more than 28,000 Health and Human Service programs throughout Los Angeles County, 24 hours a day, seven days a week and is TTY accessible. 211 LA County, formerly known as INFO Line of Los Angeles, has been providing these services since 1981.

An excellent opportunity to serve your community is the Community-Police Advisory Boards (CPABs). Each of the 21 geographic Areas in the Los Angeles Police Department has a CPAB. The purpose of the CPAB is to provide advice to the Area Commanding Officer regarding decreasing the incidence and fear of crime in the community, as well as to provide community members with a voice in the policing of their communities. CRIME AND SAFETY REPORT

With the summer coming to an end, the Pacific Division statistics have shown an 8.5% decrease in overall crime until the Venice Boardwalk incident where a driver injured several persons and killed one pedestrian. The LA City Council and LAPD are looking into ways to make this area safer.

On Tuesday, August 13th, the One West Bank on Sawtelle and National was robbed by armed persons just after opening. No suspects have been apprehended. REMEMBER if you see a police helicopter circling overhead, please stay inside your house, the police are searching for someone.

The Pacific Division held this year's National Night Out at Mar Vista Park on Tuesday, August 6th. This event afforded the opportunity for the community to become familiar with the police officers who serve our area. In attendance were Captains, all the Senior Lead officers, detectives and patrol officers as well as our local councilmen. There was a friendly softball game, free BBQ, self-defense demonstration and school supplies given out to the children.

At the quarterly Block Captain meeting on Aug, 8th, representatives from the downtown call center gave a

presentation. LA call centers receive about 4 million calls per year with 2.3 million being 911 calls, 70% of the 911 calls are non-emergency. The 911 call is for:

A life threatening emergency

Preservation of life

A crime in progress

Non-emergency calls: 1 877-ASK-LAPD

Our Senior Lead Officer, Drake Madison has just been reassigned. His replacement has yet to be selected. For emergencies, call 911. Whenever possible, use a "land line" to call 911 in emergency situations, as this brings up your address. Cell phones do not provide instant locations, but to the nearest cell tower. This may delay help. The 911 operators ask several questions, not only to get basic information, but to keep you on the line in case the situation changes. The operator is dispatching information to officers at the same time he/she is talking with you. So please be patient.

Although the "Knock-Knock" burglaries seem to have moved on to the Cheviot Area, there are still residential burglaries in Pacific Division. At least half of the homes are entered through OPEN/UNLOCKED doors and windows. If you have been a victim of a residential burglary, the LAPD Knock-Knock-Task force has recovered property available for viewing online. Check the website:

Identity theft is becoming the fastest growing crime in our society. If you become a victim, file your police report at the Pacific Division station (our home division). The report will then be sent to the Forgery Unit located in the WLA police station.



Do You Have Spare Time To Make A Difference?

A year ago, I discovered that the 826LA Tutoring Center moved to Mar Vista and was looking for volunteer tutors. I signed up and started working in the after school tutoring program and, this summer, in the English Language Learner (ELL) camp. If you have time and a desire to help children, come and join me!

826LA is a non-profit writing and tutoring center that provides free programs for students, teachers, and schools in our community. These programs rely on the help and altruism of volunteers. 826LA has two centers, one in Mar Vista and one in Echo Park. Last year, between the two centers, they served over 8,000 students. This is part of a national organization that supports eight centers around the country which are supported by donors including Google, the Goldhirsh Foundation, and many other foundations and individuals.

In addition to after school tutoring, the center offers a variety of other programs. Volunteers can go to schools around LA and do workshops on writing; high school students can sign-up for one-on-one sessions to receive help preparing their college applications and ELL students can participate in a four-week summer "camp" which I helped with this summer.

The after school program which runs from 3 to 6 PM, Monday through Thursday is housed in a large room behind the "Time Travel" store at 12515 Venice Blvd. During work sessions, students sit around big tables with 1 or 2 volunteers. The younger students, age 6 to 11, come in the afternoons and older students come to the evening sessions. The photo shows the



group hard at work. Students require concentrated help in the first hour or two and after they are done with their homework volunteers work with them on reading and writing. Every six weeks a book of the students' writing is published.

Students come from all over the West LA area. Most often, families hear about 826LA through word of mouth, through the free writing workshops, or because the student came to 826LA on a field trip. Most of the students come from schools where the majority qualify for free or reduced price lunch, and the focus is on serving underserved students in our community. Family members or friends drop off and pick up the students.

Volunteers for the after school program range from college students to retirees. There is a short training program that covers the program goals. Volunteers must to be able to help with elementary school math and language arts. However staff members and other volunteers are always available to help if another volunteer gets stuck in the process of working with the kids. I found myself trying to help a student with a worksheet written only in Spanish, but a Spanish speaking staff member came to my rescue and helped to translate for me. I have helped other volunteers with math worksheets. Volunteers with an interest in art can provide a special class at 4:30 for those who finish their homework.

The tutoring center staff are young and energetic. Several of them are AmeriCorps VISTA members. They also work on programs other than the after school tutoring, but they circulate during the afternoon to help students and volunteers. A staff member is on hand to check in students and volunteers and assign each to tables.

As a volunteer, one of the things that appealed to me is the flexibility of the job. Each week, volunteers get an email message with a link to the web site for each day. Volunteers can then sign up for none or many days each week. If we are traveling or very busy, I can skip a week. Normally, I sign up for one day each week. Often I can't leave until 6 PM, but other times my students get picked up by their parents early so then I am free to leave. If you must leave, you can leave early.

SUMMER ON ALLASEBA DRIVE

My favorite evenings on my street are the summer ones, when I hear the children calling.

They pour out of the houses as the sun moves low in the sky. Some ride scooters. Some have bikes, rollerblades. Mini-motorcycles. My kids catch the sound of a giggle or a screech and they dart out the door, mid-whatever.

"But... dinner..." I call after them.

"Give us 10 minutes!" they say, and I hear the front door slam behind them.

I probably should be firmer. I should make them adhere to my schedule. But I grew up on a hilly avenue in Encino, with no sidewalks and no children other than me and my brother. I dreamed of having just one friend in walking distance. My three kids have much more than that; they have choices. A crowd, even. So I tend to let them be.

When we went looking for a home 14 years ago, I was all about floor plan: central hallway, spacious kitchen, easy entry to the backyard. Typical child of a real estate agent. But my husband was about neighborhood: tree-lined street, light traffic, walkable location. So I picked the house but, after so many others that he nixed, Bill picked Allaseba Drive.

At the time, we were the first new family on the block in nearly two decades. Since then, there's been plenty of "turn-over," real estate's euphemism for what happens when elderly residents die or move away to retirement homes. We've lost the lady who appeared at our front door the day we moved in, proffering a chocolate cake from Vons. We still miss the World War II flying ace who handed our kids puppy calendars, and his wife who kept instant pudding cups in the pantry for hungry toddlers. The elderly pianist who practiced for hours no longer resides in the gray house on the corner, and the centenarian who lived on the opposite end of our short block is also no more.

But then I look out the window. The light is fading. From the street I hear adult voices, too. When I go to my front door, I see lots of neighbors, some with young kids, some whose kids are grown and moved away, all chatting.

It's the street I always wanted, right out there, if only I wasn't in the middle of something else.

But there's a solution to that. Put the spatula down. Turn the stove off. It will be dark soon. Dinner can wait.
